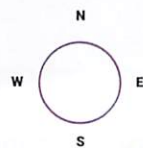
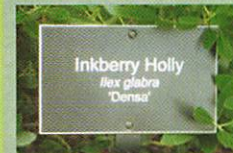

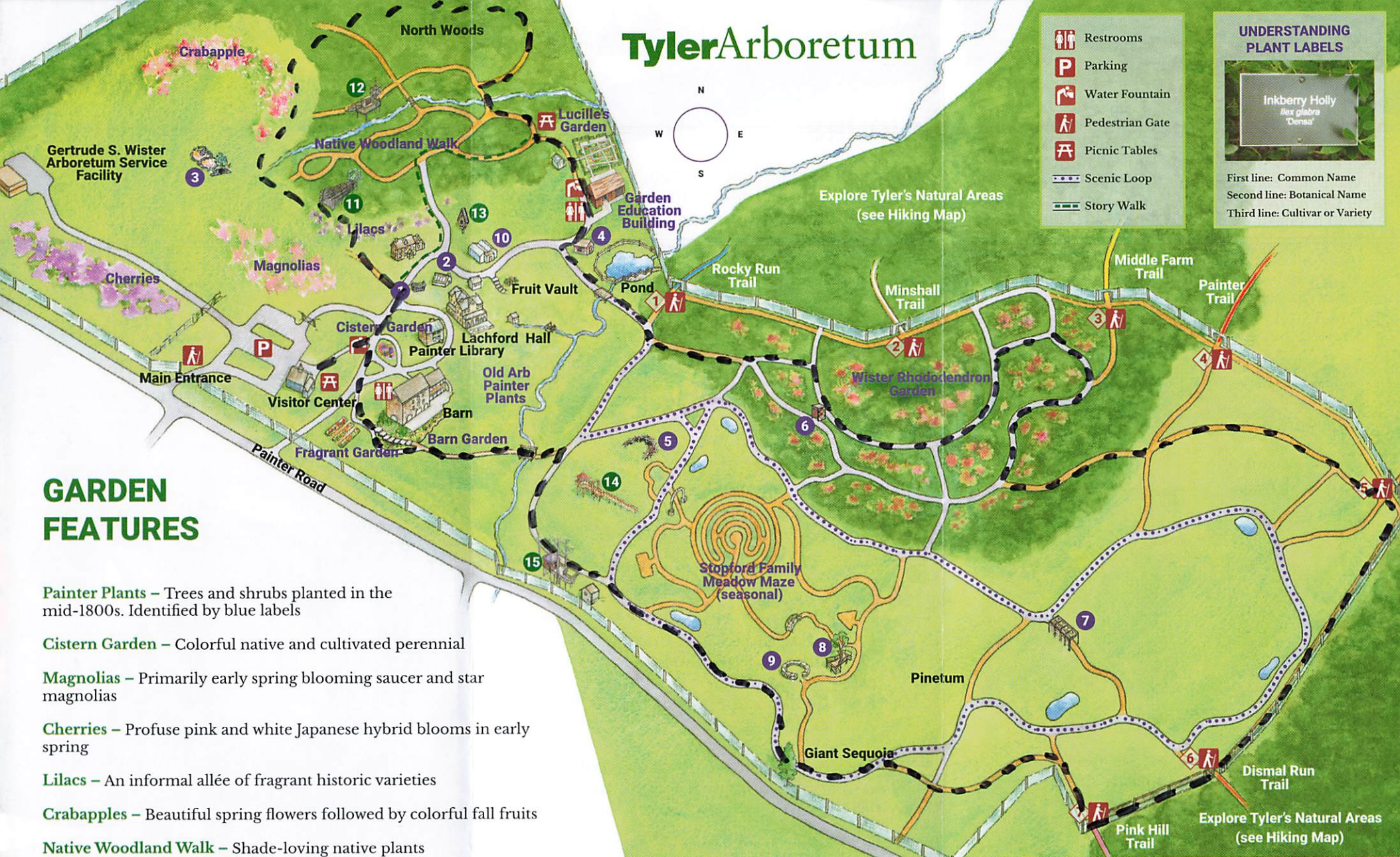

First line: Common Name
 Second line: Botanical Name
 Third line: Cultivar or Variety



GARDEN FEATURES

Painter Plants – Trees and shrubs planted in the mid-1800s. Identified by blue labels

Cistern Garden – Colorful native and cultivated perennial

Magnolias – Primarily early spring blooming saucer and star magnolias

Cherries – Profuse pink and white Japanese hybrid blooms in early spring

Lilacs – An informal allée of fragrant historic varieties

Crabapples – Beautiful spring flowers followed by colorful fall fruits

Native Woodland Walk – Shade-loving native plants

Lucille's Garden – A seasonal bounty of vegetables, fruits, and herbs

Wister Rhododendron Garden – Nationally-recognized collection of over 1,500 specimens of azaleas and rhododendrons

Fragrant Garden – Culinary and fragrant herbs and plants

Stopford Family Meadow Maze – A labyrinth and meadow ecology garden
