exceptionally attractive to honey bees. Give this one room, as it can spread to three of four feet across. Prune back by half every six months to reduce woodiness. Very fast growing - ideal for filling empty spots. The plant prefers dry conditions, very drought tolerant. It is a tender perennial and is grown here as an annual or a houseplant.
